This half of term has been a real mix of things for the Primary team! We've been continuing to create weekly online assemblies as well as gradually returning to some in-person school visits. It's been exciting for us to return to some in-person work, seeing familiar faces in schools, and enjoying the back and forth we can have with our audience in-person. In the new year we'll be phasing out our regular online content, and gradually adding more and more school visits back into our routine.

We've also been preparing a new self-esteem workshop project. In our time in schools, we've seen the need for something to help support young children in this area, so for a




while we've been looking for just the right kind of resource to help us. Thankfully, God has provided in the form of the 'Like Me' project from Scripture Union. Using this resource and adapting it slightly, we've been able to trial run half-day workshops focussing on helping children to consider their self-esteem, their value and their friendships, all from a Christian perspective.



As we look forward towards the new year, we're also gearing up for the re-

turn of the LIFE exhibition!
Another exciting project we usually run every other year, giving year 5-6 students the opportunity to see what Christians believe about Jesus and to consider what they themselves think about Jesus too.

So, things are busy for the Primary Team! But our work is full of many good things that are exciting for us, and hopefully encouraging and inspiring for the children we see each week.





Lunch Clubs On the 28th September, the secondary team got to do their first proper

lunch club in 18 months. We played small games, big games, chatted about all sorts of things and with 40 year 7s crammed into the room we had, we got to share with them the story of the prodigal son, and the fact that they are unconditionally loved by our awesome God.

As a team we have missed being able to connect with kids in this way. We were so blessed to be able to do



some smaller, socially distant lunch clubs last year, but it has been great to more or less be back to normal. We are back doing assemblies, lunch clubs, Christian unions, mentoring and, excitingly, more of this than we were doing pre-covid. Each week we are interacting with over 100 young people across the city in our clubs, but also a real highlight for this term has been our brand new year 7 lunch club in St James' school. ICE used to have a big presence in that school, which in recent years had fallen away. But, thanks to our partnerships with ISCA church and St Matt's church, we have been able to start a new club, connect with a group of young people, and help them explore the idea that there is more to life than they might realise.



We have also expanded our ministry at Exeter College. Because the

College has retained some of its social distancing measures this year, there isn't a common lunch break across the campus which makes it harder to run our Christian union. But in the wake of this challenge, the college requested we run two CU meetings instead, which meant a bigger team, and also the ability to support more young people who know Jesus, and reach more that don't know him yet.



Lastly, our mentormentoring ing programme is still going well. We

are underway with roughly half of the mentoring team, and hope to get the others started soon. This is such an important ministry because there are so many young people who could really benefit from one-to-one support in our city. It is a ministry that ICE has had a heart for this need for so long and we are really glad that we are starting to meet it.
